## Dear Students,

As you know, the College held vaccination clinics for the first dose of the meningitis B vaccine on Sunday, February 8<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday, February 11<sup>th</sup>. All undergraduate students and eligible graduate students were asked to attend one of the clinics to either receive the vaccine or complete an opt-out form.

Undergraduate students or eligible graduate students who were not able to attend one of the clinics need to make an appointment at the student health center to either receive the vaccine or to sign the opt-out form. Please call 401-865-2422 for an appointment.

This vaccination is a three-dose vaccine. The second dose will be given on or about <u>April 8th</u> and a third dose will be given sometime in August. College officials will keep students informed as the details of these clinics are finalized.

## About the vaccine:

- -The vaccine is approved only for individuals who are 10 to 25 years old.
- -There is no cost to any student who wishes to be vaccinated.
- -Prior meningitis vaccinations students may have received DO NOT protect against the Group B strain of meningitis.
